

## Prime Minister's Scholarships (PMS) - Criteria for Assessing Individual Applications

## The goals of the PMS are to:

- strengthen New Zealand institutions' connections with their counterparts in key Asian or Latin American countries
- promote understanding of the strength and quality of New Zealand's education system and raise awareness in Asia or Latin America of New Zealand as a preferred education destination
- develop global citizens and improve the international skills of the New Zealand workforce
- strengthen people to people connections between New Zealand and countries in Asia or Latin America through participants building lifelong friendships and networks
- strengthen New Zealand's ability to engage with key Asian or Latin American trading partners
- improve New Zealanders' understanding of Asian or Latin American business practices and cultures

Alignment of the candidate's programme with scholarship goals (mark out of 15, where 15 is high)</li> <li>Candidate's application <ul> <li>Shows a clear understanding of all of the PMS aims/goals and why they are important</li> <li>Clearly outlines how they, and their programme links to New Zealand's education, trade and economic agenda in the region</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Criteria 2. Quality of the proposed plan (mark out of 20, where 20 is high)</li> <li>Richness of plan – candidate's plan outlines a range of activities that together contribute to the goals of the scholarship (i.e. not just single focus)</li> <li>Outlines the benefits of proposed programme in the short and long term, and how it links with their career aspirations</li> <li>Candidate's video clearly demonstrates their positive motivation to achieve personal goals and the goals of the scholarship</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Criteria 3. Quality of the Candidate – The candidate's personal attributes (mark out of 15, where 15 is high)</li> <li>Candidate demonstrates personal attributes that means they will represent both New Zealand and their home institution positively, particularly the value of their New Zealand education experience</li> <li>Candidate's referee reports positively support application</li> <li>Overall impression of candidate is highly favourable</li> <li>Candidate has the ability to succeed in their chosen programme</li> <li>Candidate demonstrates a prior or current commitment to the region</li> </ul>
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
