Process summary & scale



- Core questionnaire covering arrival, learning, living, support, recommendation, application and choice of school
- Semi-standardised online questionnaire format, adapted and customised for the New Zealand schools sector
- Survey available in 5 languages:
 English, Chinese (simplified), Japanese, Korean and Thai
- Students invited to feedback from May to July 2015
- 2,162 international students aged 16+ responded from 91 schools (up from 1,871 respondents in 2012)









Summary



- Generally, there are relatively high levels of satisfaction amongst international students studying at New Zealand secondary schools
 - 94% of students happy with their experience at their school
 - 88% happy with their life in New Zealand
 - 75% would recommend their school to others thinking of applying there
- Satisfaction is largely in line with the last survey in 2012
- While this may be seen as a positive result, it does still leave a number of young students who are unhappy with their school and life in New Zealand
 → Understanding the reasons behind this and working to address them is important for both individual schools and for the sector as a whole
- Particular areas that may benefit from attention:
 - Students' arrival at their school
 - Improving integration between international and New Zealand students
 (maybe more of a challenge at schools with large numbers of international students)
 - Making international students feel more welcome in New Zealand.



Summary



- There is considerable variation in satisfaction between different groups of students – students at different schools, of different nationalities, etc.
 - → Drilling down into the results will help in understanding expectations and experiences of different groups and in ensuring that New Zealand schools are an attractive option for international students.












How happy are you with your experience at this school?








Overall happiness by student type


















Propensity to recommend by nationality

Because the attitude the staff act to me are not nice, when I have problem not staff help me to solve it I am very disappointed with it

















Factors in study decision (% important)














Thinking back, how happy were you with your first few days at this school?

Comments on the arrival experience



some of the students just ask you two question like what's your name is and where you come from and that's it..so it was quite hard at the beginning to make kiwi friends










How happy are you with your experience of learning at this school?

Comments on the learning experience



I think the school should support more the international students that want to go to university above, because they not always are familiarized with the process and need more help on that








Learning rating – Subject choice




How happy are you with the choice of subjects you have at this school?








Overall happiness with living arrangements by nationality

I hope we have unlimited Wi-Fi for study but most of family does have this facility so we can't contact our family easily. We need to use the Wi-Fi carefully




















