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Round 2 – 6 group scholarships

Massey University	Encounter across languages and cultures in Brazil	13 scholars to undertake a 4-week programme in Brazil. Aotearoa and Brazil share many commonalities, including a rich indigenous culture, a complex colonial history, vibrant and socially-engaged art, a diverse cultural and linguistic landscape, and interest in the development of local, national and global citizenship opportunities. Students will explore these shared interests from different points of view, with a focus on how languages reflect the complexity and richness of cultural identity and diversity. This programme will contribute to enriching the encounter across languages and cultures and to the continuity and strengthening of existing cultural, commercial, academic and diplomatic relationships between both countries.
Lincoln University	Agribusiness Summer School, UFV, ESALQ/USP, UFSC, Brazil	15 scholars to undertake a 4-week programme to three universities in Brazil. The Agribusiness programme will provide students with an opportunity to place their agribusiness theory into a real international context. An important component of this experience is an opportunity to learn about Latin American business practice and culture.
University of Auckland	Indigenous Rights & History with Campus B - Brazil	10 scholars to undertake a 4-week programme that will offer students a heuristic experience of Brazil through interactions with Brazilians and a full itinerary of activities immersing them in Brazil's historical indigenous landscape. The proposed programme schedule comprises a range of activities, visits, lectures, tours and workshops that explore and support innovative and sustainable venues across São Paulo, Ubatuba and Brasília.
Massey University	Colombia-Aotearoa: Cultural Diversity and Language Across the Pacific, Bogota, Colombia	6 scholars to undertake a 4-week cultural and language immersion project in Colombia aiming to foster a greater understanding of the Spanish language and Latin American cultures, through the exploration of key cultural aspects that both Colombia and New Zealand share, namely, societies which feature communities from a variety of cultural and ethnic backgrounds.
Victoria University of Wellington	Sustainable Development Programme at Insper and Amazonia EDU in Brazil	10 scholars will undertake a 4-week summer school on 'sustainable development'. The first part of the programme will be delivered at Insper led by Insper and VBS academics at Sao Paulo. For the second part the students will travel to the Amazon region for a programme led by Fundação Amazonas Sustentável (FAS) and co-taught by academics from FAS, Insper and VBS.
AUT University	Computational Infrastructure programme at Universidad de Los Andes, Bogota, Colombia	8 scholars will undertake a 6-week programme in Computational Infrastructure offered in collaboration with Universidad de Los Andes (UniAndes) in Bogotá. The course includes language classes, lectures, tutorials and academic field trips and a number of additional cultural and social activities.
