Entry requirements

Study abroad

(1 or 2 semesters)

Enrolment at a Higher Education Institution

Intermediate level of Portuguese (for subjects offered in that language)

Recommended: minimum average of 7 (out of 10)

Students can study subjects offered by our schools. Restrictions may apply to Medicine, Nursing, Psychology and Biomedical Engineering)

Brazilian Studies

(45-hour modules / Feb-June or Aug/Nov)

Modules: Current Social Issues in Brazil / Brazilian Politics and Society

Enrolment at a Higher Education Institution

Brazilian Portuguese: Language and Culture

(60-hour course)

Intensive modules (3 weeks): January / July

Extensive modules (15 weeks): Feb-June / Aug-Nov

At least, certificate of secondary school

Minimum age: 18 years old

Internship at the International Office

(non-paid / 20 hours per week / 4 to 16 weeks)

Enrolment at a Higher Education Institution (major in International Relations or similar)

Recommended: minimum average of 7 (out of 10) and Intermediate level of Portuguese or Spanish



Course delivery language

Study abroad

Portuguese is the main language of instructions, so at least the intermediate level of Portuguese is required.

Only a few electives are offered in English, such as Strategic Management, International Finance Management, Services Marketing, and International Arbitration. The list of electives in English is only available 2 months before the beginning of the academic semester. For electives taught in English, Portuguese language is not required.

Brazilian Studies

Modules: Current Social Issues in Brazil / Brazilian Politics and Society

The program is taught in English. Portuguese language is not required.

Brazilian Portuguese: Language and Culture

That's a language program offered in 3 levels: beginners, intermediate and advanced.

Study abroad

Students are required to enroll in at least 4 credits. As for 2016, depending on the program/major, the tuition for a 4-credit subject is approx. R\$ 2500.
